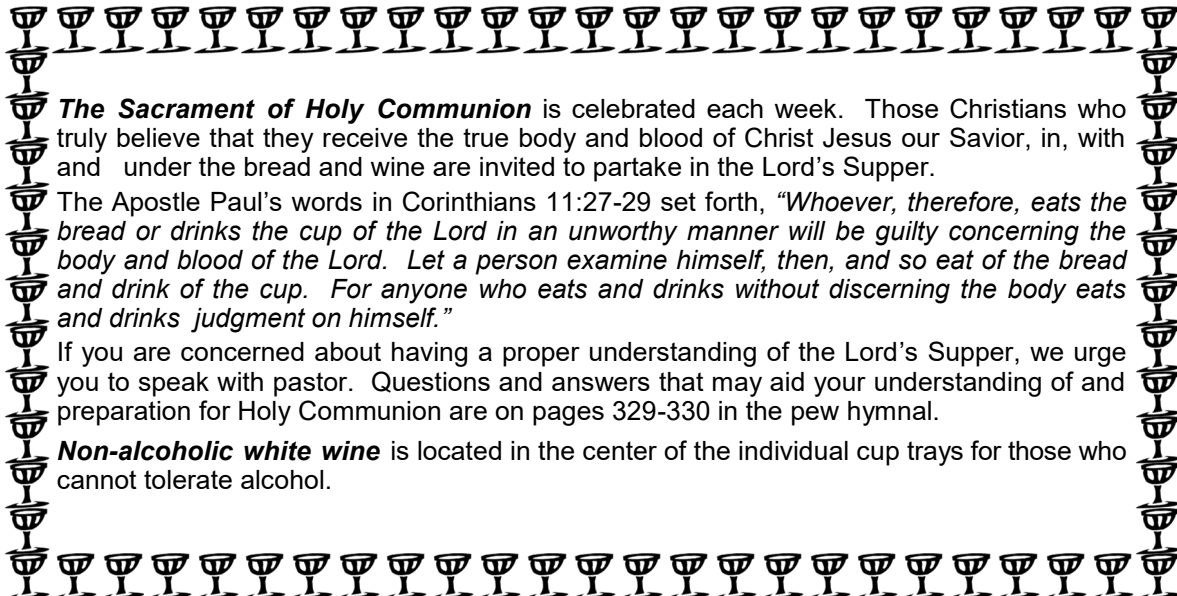

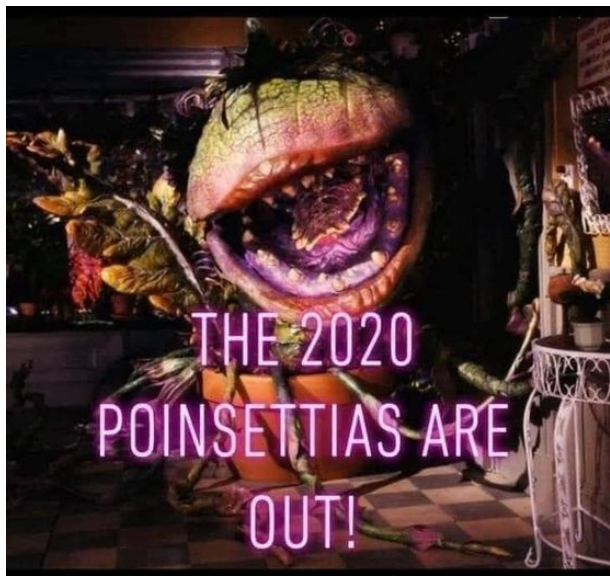

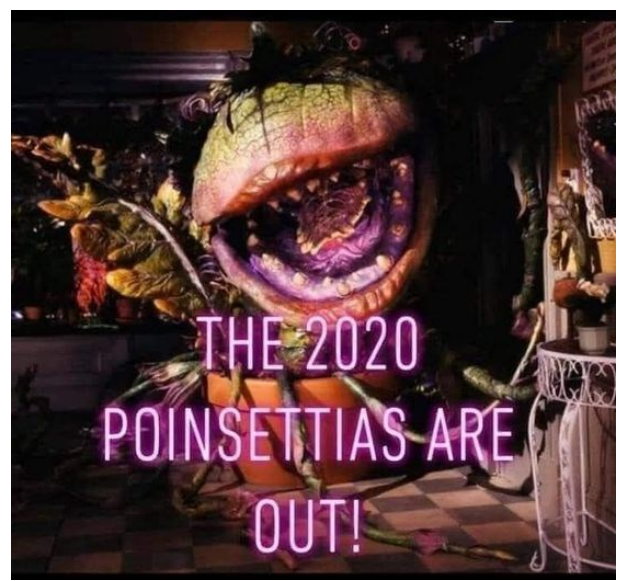
Time To Order Poinsettias
