Pastor's corner:

Why Come Back? Jesus!

I have been looking forward to writing this article. It has been a very long and weird year with much to lament, but finally it looks like things are getting somewhat back to normal and we can finally talk about (drumroll please) everybody getting back to church!

Terrebonne Parish's positivity numbers are quite low and every day the vaccination numbers are climbing. Maybe we aren't there yet, but soon we will reach a point where church attendance cannot be considered a risk anymore. Praise the Lord!

The Facebook live streaming service has been a great blessing during the year of Covid. It has not only allowed regular attenders to do so from home while mitigating risk of infection, but also allowed others near and far who weren't coming in person to regularly hear the Gospel proclaimed. We even gained a new member through it! Because of this success we intend to keep broadcasting into the foreseeable future.

That said, there is the concern that some folks will have become too comfortable watching service from home in bed and won't return to live worship when the risk has abated. Don't be that person! Let's face it, as fallen creatures we had a tendency to be lackadaisical about our faith before we ever heard of Covid-19. Doing church from bed in your pajamas after the pandemic is over is like proclaiming it! Knowing that there is such temptation I thought now a good time to proffer some points to ponder on why that would be a bad Christian practice.

Jesus said so. After Peter correctly proclaim Jesus as the Messiah, Christ said, "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." The word translated into English as "church" simply means "assembly" or "gathering" in the Greek. Jesus envisioned His people as those that gather around His Word and Sacraments—in person. Christians have always done this, even when doing so under persecution might cost them their lives. To deny assembling is to deny Christ's directive.

We need you. You may think your faith is just fine doing church sitting on your tuches* at home. (You're wrong, but that's another article.) St. Paul admonishes Christians to "encourage one another and build one another up." A Christian doing life in a fallen world opposed to Christ gets worn down. Sunday worship is refreshment where he can gather with the faithful and be encouraged and strengthened by their presence. If you're absent, you're robbing them of your encouragement.

It encourages the church's members and her pastors. Seeing an empty church is depressing. Sure, God still works with the few in an empty church. But there is strength in number—strength of voices in singing praise, strength of proclamation in saying the prayers and liturgy together. Strength of compassion in being there to share in one another's joys and sorrows. As a pastor I know that God works through the proclaimed word as He wills, but still, preaching to an empty room disheartens a preacher.

And the even bigger "Jesus said so". On the night before his death Jesus gave clear instruction to "Do this, in remembrance of me"—the Lord's Supper which is "for you, for the forgiveness of sins." You cannot avoid the clear truth that forgiveness, life and salvation is served up for you weekly in the Eucharist. If you continually remain home when Christ is physically there for you at the rail, you are effectively saying "No thanks" to His gifts of grace.

These are just a few critical points to ponder as the world reopens and the doors of the church beckon you, "Oh taste and see that the Lord is good."

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."
