Pastor's Corner

Word to the Wise

"Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world." (1 John 4:1) What is the measure by which we test the spirits—the messages and leadings that come at us in the world each day? What guide tells us whether a leading is of God, of Satan, or maybe just neutral?

I'd hope most of us would say God's Word is the measure. St. Paul writes, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." (2 Timothy 3:16) But do Christians today know that Word, or do they happily sing "Jesus loves me, this I know" and leave it at that? Could you list the summary of God's Law that is the Ten Commandments? Do you know the basic Christian truths presented in Luther's Small Catechism?

The Divine Service is wonderful and God's gracious gifts are given there in abundance. But it is God's Holy Spirit at work through the Word of promise that protects, sustains and uplifts you out in the world. God says through the prophet Jeremiah, "I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be my people." He has done so. Are you abiding in it?




