Pastor's Corner

Meaningless Toil

"What does man gain by all the toil at which he toils under the sun?" (Ecclesiastes 1:3)

Sometimes it seems the answer to that question is "nothing". The book of Ecclesiastes came to mind after I'd spent a whole afternoon spreading dirt donated by a local swimming pool installer over the flood-prone low spot on the church property under two of our oak trees. A couple days later it was explained to me that the dirt would suffocate the roots and kill the trees within a year. The dirt had to be removed. All that work was for naught.

I'll admit, my first internal reaction to this news was not very Christian. But later it struck me that this is just how our earthly life is. The author of Ecclesiastes highlights how we work for years yet there is always this seeming meaningless to it because this life ends. It's like moving dirt around until we return to the dust from which we came. Yet we do this under a loving God.

"Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ." (Colossians 3:23-24)


Standing in one's Holy Baptism, everything you do apart from sin is pleasing in God's sight and serves His kingdom. Maybe pointlessly moving that dirt taught me something. Maybe it was discipline. Who knows-maybe it just made God laugh! Maybe it had nothing to do with me at all. Whatever. It's all good. Jesus' death looked pitiful and pointless as He hung dying on the cross. Yet the Father's will was being done that sinners would be saved. Because of Him we know this life isn't meaningless—it's lived in service to Christ as we head toward forever life in His presence. We do everything as His child, and thus to His glory. Be content in your toil, even if it is just moving dirt around.

What do we gain by it? Everything, because Christ has already

gained us the kingdom.

Parts of the Liturgy: Invocation

God calls us to worship and thus we invoke His name as we begin by the pastor making the sign of the cross and stating: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The congregation affirms his statement with "Amen."

One function of the Invocation is a remembrance of the name into which we stand baptized, thus it is appropriate if those gathered cross themselves also.

While God is present everywhere, the Invocation is an affirmation that He is among His people bearing His gifts of grace because Jesus clearly says in Matthew's Gospel, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

The Invocation is also a public proclamation identifying the God we worship. Many claim some type of spirituality or adhere to a god of some sort. By declaring the name of the Triune God clearly revealed in Holy Scripture and the Christian creeds derived from it, there can gather to worship.
