Our Daily Goal

What is your goal in life? The way we answer likely changes over the years. When we're young we dream of fame, fortune, popularity and success. Later those desires can focus more toward good relationships, well-adjusted children, happiness and contentment. Late in life the goal is health, absence of pain, not falling down in the bathroom.

Not that such desires are necessarily sinful, but they are pretty centered on self. But what should be our primary goal at any age? "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2)

The goal of our life is to do the will of God. It's that simple. Our sinful nature grinds against this idea, always desiring to be a god unto ourselves. But God's will is perfect, and that we be saved for eternity, so God's will is indeed best.

Accepting this rather basic Christian truth, apply it every day. Instead of praying that God bless your plans for your day, step back and seek His will for the day instead. You'll likely be doing the same things that day, but you'll be seeking to do them all to His glory according to His design of love.

Our goal is a simple one: to live in the crucified and risen Christ into whom we have been baptized; living His gift of holy, eternal life today. We've been enabled to live this way by His grace alone; it is our joy and privilege to do so.

"For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which

God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

Start out each day recognizing whose will is best for you; then seek to humbly walk therein.


