## Pastor's Corner

What to Talk About

A lament frequently voiced in the church today is about how people seem to have abandoned the Christian faith. Church attendance and the number of those claiming faith in Christ has experienced steady decline in western culture for decades, especially among the young. Very recently "Generation Z" has been a ray of hope as we're finally seeing an uptick in spiritual curiosity and even a return to the faith in church membership. How can we build on this?

Obviously, we do nothing if we aren't willing to open our mouth so talking to folks about the faith is the first step. But what do we say? We can speak about the law and the need for forgiveness. We can speak of morality and goodness. We can speak of the peace faith brings. We can even speak of the joys of fellowship within the family of faith that is Christ's church. But our tendency seems to be a focus on the individual and what faith can do for him or her.

That's not the approach the prophet Joel takes. "Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and He relents over disaster."


God's Word ultimately proclaims God; what He has done in general, but most pointedly what He does in Christ crucified and risen. It's fine to talk about life, morality, the church, what one is seeking spiritually.

But Jesus is who we should always put front and center.

The next time you enjoin a conversation with the aim of drawing someone to Christ, make your first priority to make Christ the center of the conversation. Don't focus on the church, but on the cornerstone on which His church is built.
