Pastor's Corner

I'm always a bit melancholy on Good Friday afternoon as I drive to church. Some of it is because of the somberness of the day. But during the drive much of it is because I see the groups of cars crowded at house after house, knowing that most folks will party with family well into the evening, not at all marking the sacrifice of our Lord on the cross.

Yet that is not surprising. Most of Jerusalem were oblivious to Christ's suffering on the cross while they enjoyed the Passover holiday. Later most of Jerusalem ignored the good news of the resurrection. Throughout the centuries most of mankind has ignored the Gospel. We who received and believe it are privileged; blessed by the gift of faith through the Holy Spirit.

Every day, but especially on Good Friday, we remember and ponder the terrible and glorious work our Lord performed to save us. "But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—everyone—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all." (Isaiah 53:5-6)

Don't go the way of the world. Don't ignore the work of Christ. It is somber in bringing to mind your sins that sent Him to the cross. But it all leads to the empty tomb. It all leads to your salvation unto life everlasting. It all leads to the joyous presence of Christ in your life today and forever.
